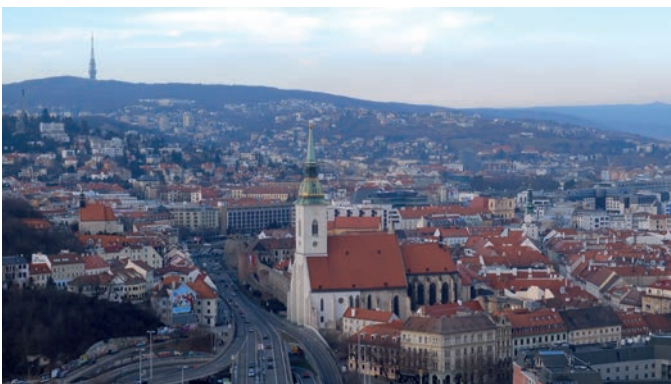




## Bratislava Castle

From the Bratislava Castle you can see Petržalka, the oldest housing estate in the city, SNP Bridge, Old Bridge, Apollo Bridge, the UFO Watchtower, Janko Král Park and, of course, the Danube River. The castle courtyard can be accessed also in the evenings so you can enjoy the sunset there.

## UFO

Use the elevator of the UFO Watchtower, and in 45 seconds get off at a viewing platform at a height of 95 metres. From the viewing platform you will see a magnificent panoramic view of the whole Bratislava and its dominant features. The watchtower is open until 11 p.m., giving you the opportunity to see Bratislava immersed in the dark.

## Vápenná

Vápenná is the third highest hill of the Small Carpathians which is situated near the village of Sološnica. At its top, there is an approximately four-metre tall pillar with a viewing platform from which you can enjoy a unique panoramic view of the endless forests of the Small Carpathians. You can reach Vápenná Hill following the red tourist sign from Sološnica.

## Modranská Tower

## Kamzík

Kamzík has two look-out sites. The Kamzík television tower provides a magnificent panoramic view of the entire surroundings of Bratislava and in case of good weather also of the Alps. From the tourist look-out tower below Kamzík you can enjoy views of Bratislava, the Danube River and the surrounding Small Carpathians forests. Kamzík can be reached on foot, by car, by public transport or by a cableway.

## Devínska Kobyla

You can reach this viewing tower from the Modra-Piesok recreation complex with the famous chalet of Zochova chata.
